

Therefore, before dissecting the poems of Homer, or rather vivisectioning them, for they yet live, let us admire the beauty of their form, the firmness of their outlines, the purity of their Greek features, all the soul which gives expression to them. And this we may do without plunging any of the questions to which these poems have given rise; for those who advocate the hypothesis of several authors are as warm in the praise of our existing Homer, as are the supporters of Homer's univocal authorship.
